The Data Dictionary of the Nebraska Community Opportunity Map provides the following information for each data point listed as part of the Nebraska Community Opportunity Map:

- Detailed indicator definition
- General and specific source information
- Data type (e.g. rate per 1,000)
- Age range
- Specific numerator used to calculate the rate
- Specific denominator used to calculate the rate
- Timeframe
- Data suppression information, if relevant



HOW IS THE DATA DICTIONARY ORGANIZED?

The Data Dictionary is organized in alphabetical order, by indicator title.



Child Abuse and Neglect Reports

Definition: Child abuse and neglect substantiated reports are a subset of the total number of reports of child maltreatment that were made in a given year. “Substantiated” means that a determination was made that the incident of maltreatment did occur. “Child maltreatment” is defined by the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services as physical, emotional, or sexual harm done to a child 18 and under. This harm may occur either through abuse or neglect. The child abuse and neglect substantiated report rate is the number of such reports per 1,000 individuals age 18 and under in a given county.

Children in Out-of-Home Care

Definition: The out-of-home care rate is the number of children in out-of-home care per 1,000 individuals 18 and under in a given county. Included in this population are: 1) state wards in out-of-home care through the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services (NDHHS), 2) young people out-of-home who are supervised by the Juvenile Division of the Administrative Office of Probation, 3) state wards placed at the Youth Residential Treatment Facility (YRTC), and 4) young people who are involved in more than one of the above systems. Excluded from this population are state wards currently on a trial home visit. Out-of-home care data presented reflects a point-in-time count as of June 30, 2017. Data includes both children who are state wards and children who are tribal wards.

Juvenile Arrests

Definition: Juvenile arrests are the number of arrests of individuals 17 and under. An arrest is counted each time a person is taken into custody or issued a citation or summons. In the case of a juvenile (defined as a person age 17 and under) an arrest is counted when they are merely warned and released without any further action. The juvenile arrest rate is the number of such arrests per 1,000 individuals age 10 to 17.
